Dear Grain Grower

Following considerable industry consultation the NZCQA Task Force agreed to proceed with the establishment of a registration based QA system to operate from the 2004 harvest onward.

The new system replaces the previous NZCQA diary system and operates on the following basis:

- Growers are required to register with the scheme, agreeing to abide by the scheme rules. On receipt of registration form, each grower will be invoiced an initial entry registration of \$250 plus GST. This amount is to be paid before they can be issued with their QA number.
- Each grower will undergo an initial audit, after which random audits will be carried out annually. This is likely to be a simple request for diary type information to be furnished.
- Growers required to furnish diaries to grain processors and required to keep all relevant information on crop inputs & grain handling in a form that is ultimately auditable.
- Growers will be invoiced \$90 plus GST annually, commencing the following year after their registration. This assists the costs of random audits being carried out.
- Grain processors will have access to the registration database to confirm individual grower registration and may choose to make the furnishing of further information a contractual obligation.

The NZCQA Taskforce urges all growers to support this industry initiative so that consumers may have ultimate confidence in locally produced grain. This scheme will hopefully satisfy the needs and concerns of all industry participants.

Explanatory Notes

Grower/Grain Trading Business:

The grower name or entity that holds the NZCQA registration should be the grower name or entity that normally markets grain to processors or merchants. A grower with more than one farm, but who markets grain through only one entity, can use one registration.

However, should a grower have more than one marketing entity, more than one registration should be made.

QA manager:

This will be the person who will take responsibility on the farm for the day to day QA requirements and occasional verification by audit.

Average area of cereals/maize grown (ha):

This figure will be the area in hectares that reflects the long term annual average area of cereals grown on the farm, or farms, that will be able to be covered by the NZCQA registration. This will enable monitoring of scheme uptake by growers and will not be disclosed to any party on an individual basis.

Production region:

This will enable the scheme to efficiently categorise grower registrations in production areas. Should growers have minor proportions of their farms in an adjacent region, the major region farmed within should be selected.

However, should growers have significant farming operations in more than one region, they should be selected and the areas of cereals grown in each should be noted on the registration form.
